

Scout Camper Form checklist

1. Completed Annual BSA Health and Medical Record.
 - a. You complete parts A & B. Part C must be completed by a doctor during a physical exam. You can obtain a physical at your regular doctor or go to a place such as Care Now. They are offering physicals for only \$12. www.carenow.com
 - b. Attach a photocopy of both sides of insurance card. If none, state NONE on form
 - c. Shots must be dated with month, day, year, OR official shot records must be attached to the medical forms
 - d. FYI, the physical exam usually includes a hernia check.
2. Medications
 - a. All prescription medications should be in the original container from the pharmacy with the Scout's name on it.
 - b. All medications, including over the counter, should be checked in with the Troop Medical Officer, Jeff Mack.
 - c. Scouts may keep epipens on themselves, but need to make the Medical Officer aware that you have it and the nature of your allergy.
3. Dietary Needs
 - a. If you have special dietary needs due to allergies, intolerance or religious reasons, please put this in writing so it can be given to the camp. They will make every effort to accommodate.
